Thoughts On My Mother

November sets us thinking about our loved ones who have died. It has me thinking about my late Mother.

There is something enormous about the experience of a maternal love, enormous and sometimes overpowering. A mother has great power over her child, even when the child is growing old and grey! Her influence is extraordinary! I'm still discovering how much I have absorbed her attitudes and opinions, opinions she had of other people that I have made my own without question.

And how like her I have become. Traits I swore I'd never take on, I suddenly find they are part of me and I find myself saying things I promised I'd never say, things I didn't like when she said them. But good traits too that were hers surface in me from time to time.

Motherhood is one of the best expressions of God that we have, especially when it is lived in faith. Next to God our Mother is the most important reality in our lives and when she is taken from us, we experience a profound shifting of the ground of our being. Profound is probably not an adequate word at all. It is a loss akin to the loss of God. We become unsteady, maybe even unstable because the reference point of life has suddenly disappeared. It takes a while to adjust.

People spoke of Mam as being nice. Nice is much too tame. She was in her time and in her ways often the wild air, the nestling air that Gerald Manley Hopkins speaks of. She was deep and strong as the ocean. Elemental!

She had at one time in her life an untamed fury but she experienced real transformation as her life progressed. Life itself transformed her, tragedy such as my sister's death brought her to a depth in which she recognised clearly what mattered most in life. The material became less significant and what mattered most was the human person.

Prayer brought about its own transformation – adoration, praying alone at home and especially the Mass. It brought her to a level of peace that was radiant, a radiance that was sometimes even visible.

The transformation we saw in her has become for us a source of hope for me. She is testament to the fact that our chaotic lives can be transformed by grace, that change is possible.
