Lessons from Laura

It's true that I am at times too sensitive to sorrow and, in week that has been emotionally very draining, it's easy to lose sight of brighter experiences that are clear reminders of how God is at work, looking after the way that life unfolds.

There has been a series of providential happenings, things that occurred exactly at the right time. First, there was the arrival in Galway of an old friend whom I hadn't seen for over forty years and it was seemingly by chance I discovered he was passing through my home town the day after I arrived there. We managed to make contact and got to spend a most pleasant hour catching up. I also found myself visiting two friends in different hospitals a couple of days before each of them died, sacred endings by which I am blessed.

Most beautiful of all was my niece Laura's First Holy Communion on May 4th, the joy of looking into the happy, innocent face of this eight-year-old child who has some understanding of the importance of what was taking place in her life. Like many a child, and many an adult for that matter, she finds Mass boring - she didn't even like the taste of Communion but I told her it's not the taste that matters but what it does to her on the inside. I'm sure that the party afterwards held much more pleasure for her because it was simply fun which the Mass is not. But two things she said resonated with me. She told her Dad, "I'm not going to call Communion 'Holy Bread' because I know it's the Body of Christ." And she also said that she knows Communion should change her on the inside, should stop her saying things she shouldn't say. Even though, from my own personal experience, I know it will take a lifetime for that change to take place completely, it has already begun in her little heart. And she is teaching me lessons that I need to learn again! It reminds me of what St. Paul says in Philippians 2 that in our minds we must be the same as Christ Jesus who emptied Himself. And that's the question I ask myself all the time - when I come to celebrate the Mass, how much like Christ am I really, in the way that I think, speak and behave? Do I have the courage to empty myself so that, like John the Baptist says of Jesus, "He must increase and I must decrease! - He must grow greater and I must grow less!"?
