The second session of the Synod 2021 to 2024 will take place in October 2024, and there are still copies of the Synthesis Report available at the back of the church. This document and Bishop Richard's 3rd edition of the Pastoral Plan, which was provided to parishioners in January, call us to a period of reflection, participation and prayer, especially Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Pope Francis has stressed that there is no Synodal Path without Adoration. Here in the parish, we have an hour of Adoration every Friday after 10am Mass. This hour of prayer will be dedicated to praying for the Synod and the Pastoral Plan.

Pope Francis has asked each local Church to consult further among parishioners to make sure people are involved everywhere. It's about listening to one another as we share our experiences and observations of the Church and help shape its future.

We will hold the second of our one-hour Small Groups down in the hall on Saturday 16th March after 10am Mass. From about 10.45 until 12 noon. The reports of this and the conversation of 2nd March will be sent to the Bishops' Conference and Rome by 22nd March.

Many thanks to all who have participated in this process over the past 2 years, and I hope you find time to join us at our Small Group Meeting on 16^{th} March.


