## **Advent & Christmas**

### NEW CHURCH YEAR – NEW BIBLE TRANSLATION – NEW PARISH A JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE!

The Season of Advent started on December 1st when we lit our first Advent candle and started a new liturgical year (Year C –St Luke's Gospel). The first Sunday is the Sunday of Hope, also the theme for the Jubilee Year 'Pilgrims of Hope' which will begin on Christmas Eve when Pope Francis will open the Holy Door in St Peter's Basillica, and invites all of us on a year of Pilgrimage.

We have also welcomed the new Lectionary / Book of the Gospels from which we hear the Word of God proclaimed at Mass in our churches and schools. These Sacred Books communicate God's presence to us in the Word, inviting us to a loving and full response in our lives and communities. After 50 years using the Jerusalem Bible our own Bishops have approved use of the English Standard Version: Catholic Edition. It is more faithful to the original Hebrew and Greek texts and will give us a fresh experience of hearing God's Word. We pray that those who listen to the spoken words, will use the knowledge and wisdom it reveals to them in living out ever more deeply and joyfully their Baptism promises.

You will also be able to read below an important update on the steps we will be taking into the new year as we become a New Single Parish, across our deanery.

Please pray for this important work and be open to being part of this journey.

Pope Francis has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee – something which happens every 25 years – with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope".

The Jubilee will offer people across our global family of faith an important opportunity to reestablish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.

It is recognised that not all can travel to the Holy Doors in Rome and for everyone to share in the celebration of the Holy Year, all Diocese Bishops are permitted to designate diocesan churches as special places of pilgrimage, where Holy Year indulgences may be gained. #### Bambinelli Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> December Bring your Baby Jesus Crib Figure to Mass

The beautiful Advent tradition of 'Bambinelli' Sunday was instituted by St Pope John Paul II during his papacy and every year on the Third Sunday of Advent families bring their 'baby Jesus' figure to St Peter's Square in the Vatican, for the Pope to bless.


On the Third Sunday of Advent this year (Sunday 15th December) some of our Deanery parishes are joining in this tradition and are inviting all local children and families to bring their baby Jesus figure from their nativity scene at home to be blessed at church.

#### Bambinelli blessings will be part of services at:

St George's, Polegate; St Wifrid's, Hailsham; St Thomas's, St Leonards; Holy Redeemer, St Leonards; St Martha's, Little Common; St Joachims, Hampden Park; St Mary Star of the Sea Hasting (4th Sunday of Advent in Hastings)

Following the blessing in church, you then take your 'bambinelli' home, wrap it in Christmas paper and put it under the Christmas tree. Then on Christmas Eve let it be the first gift you open and place it in the crib or on display.

A gift of the presence of Christ in our home this Christmas!





### Rorate Caeli Mass Friday's in Advent 6.30am at Our Lady of Ransom

The "Rorate" Mass is an ancient Advent tradition that takes its name from the first word of the Introit: Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant iustum, "Drop down dew, O heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain down righteousness." This Mass in honour of Mary is a beautiful candlelit Mass that begins in the darkness of early morning. The interplay of light and darkness as the church becomes progressively brighter with the sunrise symbolizes the coming of the Eternal Light, whom we await during the Advent season.

The first Rorate mass this Advent was attended by over 50 people, many of them our Catholic children who all delighted in the occasion before heading to school.

Attending the mass is a blessed way to start your Friday and with Breakfast available in the hall after will be ready to head to school or work afterwards.

Tickets are selling fast with the organisers already having sold over 7500 across England & Wales! That's 7500 Catholic youth and leaders in one place celebrating our Catholic faith! #### **UPDATE ON PROGRESS TO NEW SINGLE PARISH**

DEANERY OF EASTBOURNE & ST LEONARDS-on-SEA including Catholic Churches in Battle, Bexhill-on-Sea, Eastbourne, Eastbourne (Langney & Hampden Park), Hailsham & Polegate, Hastings, Rye, St Leonards-on-Sea

In November we had two very important and fruitful meetings of the Deanery clergy (priests and deacons), firstly with the Diocesan Team dedicated to overseeing the practical process of joining up our parishes, then a week later a meeting with Bishop Richard. These really helped us understand how we need to work together in a new way as a Clergy Team, working closely with parishioners from across our new large parish.

#### Many of you, along with us clergy, have been wondering what's going to happen and when?

The answer is that from January we will begin forming a **leadership structure of clergy and laity**, with representation from across our 15 church communities, who will work together to begin putting in place a concrete **Parish Pastoral Plan**, based on the Diocesan Plan with focus always on Prayer, Formation and Mission. Our Parish Plan will have clear actions and timelines to begin reorganising how we can work closely together, sharing all our best human and material resources. We will make sure that this is all communicated across the parish and give opportunity for people to participate in making the Plan concrete and the best it can be for us all. We will not be rushing to make big changes too soon but will concentrate on getting all of you who work in important church ministries to start meeting and sharing your expertise and experience. Quite quickly though we will need to audit our **Mass schedules** so that, working in our 2 Hubs ("Eastbourne" and "St Leonard's/Hastings"), we create a more realistic Mass schedule across the churches that can be managed by a smaller number of priests. This will mean people being more flexible in when and where they go to Mass. Every church community will be supported to continue as a place of worship, but just needing to be open to flexibility in how and when we provide worship. The other important work we will be undertaking thoroughly in the initial weeks of the new year will be **auditing who does what and how things work** in each of our church communities – this will allow us to start communicating and working effectively across the large "community of communities" that we will be.

This process is happening across the 11 Deaneries of the Diocese – so in the months ahead we will end up as a Diocese of 11 new large parishes. The moment that our Deanery formally and legally is constituted as a single new Parish will be some months from now; the Bishop has indicated this will probably be around June. This gives us time to get a lot of the basic new foundations in place, especially working relationships across our many church communities. Priests will substantially continue living where they are, having a particular relationship of care and pastoral oversight to the people who already know them. But little by little we will all experience being part of something larger, with all the good new opportunities that will create. When we are officially constituted as a new Parish, we will need to take on a new Parish name, something you will be invited to share your thoughts on in due course!

From January there will be more regular updates on this journey we will be making together. Please be ready and open to being involved, helping and above all praying for the Holy Spirit to guide our every step!

#### The New Single Parish and The Ministry of the Deacon

The change to a "larger single" parish will soon be upon us and so far, the Pastoral Plan has spoken in detail about the lack of priests and the future need for lay involvement but does not go into much detail about the role of the Deacon.

I thought it might be helpful to clarify the nature of the deacon's ministry and how it fits in the changes being made. A deacon is an ordained sacred minister who works closely with his bishop and priests in serving the faithful; in this he has the distinct ministry of service, which is most visible at the altar as Christ the Servant, in proclaiming the Word/Gospel and in the distribution of the Eucharist both at Mass and to the sick and housebound.

Unlike the priest, the deacon is not ordained to consecrate at Mass or provide the Sacraments of Healing but there are other sacramental and liturgical duties that a deacon can and does undertake. For example, baptisms, marriages, funerals (without Mass), house blessings, preaching and liturgies. Many deacons are actively involved in the running of their parish.

With fewer priests, the deacon, if a current parish has one, should be the person to turn to for help and guidance in the running of the community and for the provision of the sacraments. Deacons spend a good number of years preparing for their ministry by study and discernment which is ongoing, and so have been well prepared to undertake the ministry required of them in the life church. Furthermore, many deacons are family men who have had professional backgrounds which can be of added help in their ministry.

I hope that this clarifies a matter which some parishioners have been thoughtful about. With every blessing
