A big thanks to our two excellent East and West Hub Leadership Groups, the clergy and lay reps who are working hard to discern and implement good ways for us to collaborate across our churches. Thanks also to all of you in our churches who volunteer and work

hard in the Church's mission to care and reach out to others.

We are in Lent and soon will celebrate the sacrifice and Resurrection of Jesus for us. This mystery of love defines everything we do and everything we are as Church. May we all be deeply renewed to continue walking together in hope in the service of the Lord.

## The new Single Parish

Now we are without a bishop, some are wondering how this affects the journey of change we are all on in the diocese to become new larger parishes.

Already, before Archbishop Richard left us, three of the eleven deaneries of the diocese had legally become new parishes (Brighton & Hove, Guildford and Weybridge).

For the rest of us, we are asked to keep momentum on our journey of preparing, so that when a new bishop is appointed, we will be in good shape. Certainly, a new bishop will bring “fresh eyes and ears” to some of the detail of how we come together as new parishes, but he will no doubt be committed to keeping the spirit of the Pastoral Plan.

In our own deanery we have lots of work underway to help us share and collaborate together in good and helpful ways. Our new Single Parish stretches from Eastbourne to Rye, and is centred on two Hubs, West and East.

It will be overseen by a Clergy Team, moderated by Fr Kevin Dring. The team will work closely with Hub Secretaries, Hub Leadership Groups and lay representatives to support pastoral planning, governance and the shared mission of the parish.

The West Hub <sup>W</sup> covers Eastbourne, Hailsham, Hampden Park and Polegate; Battle, Bexhill, Hastings, Rye and St Leonards are in the East Hub <sup>E</sup>.

### Focus Groups – Creating a Culture of Invitation

The *Hub Leadership Teams* (HLT) have formed four Focus Groups which work across both hubs to create a consistent approach for the entire Single Parish. Each hub also has its own Stewardship Group. Working across our communities, they meet regularly and feed back to the HLT.

Their shared purpose is simple: to help create a culture of invitation across our Single Parish.

## Learning the Faith

### Children's Liturgy

Many churches in the new parish offer a Liturgy specially tailored for younger children who may find the main service difficult to follow. Those who lead this ministry are called catechists (pronounced "KAT-eh-kists") — people who generously give their time to help share the faith with the youngest members of our community.

Catechists at Our Lady of Ransom (OLR) in Eastbourne have written about their ministry in that church.

Children's Liturgy at OLR takes place each Sunday during term time at the 10:15 Mass. We cater for children aged three and above for as long as they find it helpful to them. Parents need to fill in a consent form before their children can attend. Around sixty children are registered, with between ten and twenty attending each week.

Six catechists lead the sessions, working in pairs on a rota. Through a simple *Sorry* prayer, an *Alleluia* song and the Gospel story — sometimes supported by video — the children explore the meaning of the Gospel through discussion and activities. Their work is often brought back to the church during the offertory procession so that the whole parish can share in what they have learned. New volunteers are always warmly welcomed.

### First Holy Communion

Across the deanery this year, many children and their families have been journeying together in preparation for First Holy Communion. Through parish gatherings led by dedicated catechists, children and parents have been exploring the meaning of the Eucharist and the gift of Jesus present in this sacrament.

A key emphasis of the programme has been supporting parents in their role as the first teachers of faith. Through prayer, reflection and conversation, families have been discovering together how the Eucharist nourishes our life as Christians.

All the children preparing for First Holy Communion have now celebrated their First Reconciliation — an important milestone and a joyful moment of encountering God’s mercy. Dates for First Holy Communion celebrations will be published in each church newsletter nearer the time.

**Sherilyn Barrow from St Gregory’s Church in Eastbourne shares:**

*“I started to help with children’s liturgy after COVID when my children were old enough for me to give something back. Last summer I was asked if I could support the First Holy Communion (FHC). What a blessing to see children I have seen grow in faith from their time in the Children’s Liturgy through to their FHC!*

*“I was worried I couldn’t do it, but the team are so supportive and caring. I feel I am growing into this role so hope I could support anyone else that might be thinking about joining us. With between fifty and sixty children, it is busy but so rewarding.*

*“As I have boys who play football, I never know what Mass I can attend, and it’s been so lovely to see children with their families at all the different Masses.”*

**Confirmation**

This year the deanery will celebrate two Youth Confirmation services: Our Lady of Ransom Church, Eastbourne on Saturday 3 May at 2:00pm  
St Mary Magdalene Church, Bexhill on Friday 8 May at 7:00pm

Candidates from across our parishes have spent several months meeting in formation groups, exploring the Catholic faith and reflecting on their journey with Christ. Many have also taken part in retreats and service projects, offering opportunities for prayer, reflection and service to others.

These celebrations will be a joyful moment for our parish communities as we witness our young people confirm their faith and be strengthened by the gift of the Holy Spirit.

We are also blessed this year with a number of adults preparing to be received into the Church or to complete their initiation through Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. As a vital part of their formation, and in unity with Catholic cathedrals worldwide, our catechumens and candidates participated in the Rite of Election on Saturday 21 February, held at Arundel Cathedral. Over two celebrations that day, more than 250 individuals from across the Diocese gathered alongside their sponsors, families, and friends to take this important step toward full sacramental initiation.

The liturgy was presided over by Canon Jonathan Martin, Diocesan Administrator. In his homily he spoke warmly about his own journey of faith, recalling how he himself was received into the Church at Our Lady of Ransom in Eastbourne, which he described as remaining his spiritual home.

He encouraged the Elect to remember that their call is not simply to follow rules but to follow Jesus Christ Himself, the living person at the heart of our faith.

Anyone interested in exploring the Catholic faith is warmly invited to speak with one of our clergy or parish welcome teams.

Across our parishes we give thanks for our clergy, catechists, volunteers and families who accompany children, young people and adults on their journeys of faith. ## Pupils visit St Mary Magdalene's Catholic Church

Pupils from Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 at St Mary Magdalene School Bexhill recently had the opportunity to visit and explore all areas of St Mary Magdalene Church.

The children greatly enjoyed visiting the church outside the usual celebration of Mass, which allowed them time to explore the building more fully and deepen their understanding of its meaning and significance. During the visit, they took part in a guided tour and learned about the key areas of the church, strengthening both their knowledge and their spiritual awareness.

We are especially grateful to Mrs Surman, one of our Foundation Governors, who generously gave her time to lead the visits. She provided

the pupils with an in-depth explanation of the Order of Mass and helped them to understand important practices and traditions of the Church. The children learned, for example, how and why we genuflect when passing the tabernacle, why the Gospel is proclaimed by a Priest or Deacon, and how the Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated. Mrs Surman also shared insights into the saints and the rich symbolism found within the church. One particularly memorable detail for the pupils was discovering the meaning behind the pelican depicted on the altar — perhaps parishioners might like to ask the children if they can recall its significance.

We are thankful for the warm welcome extended to our pupils and for the continued support of our parish community in nurturing their faith and understanding.

## Living the Gospel at School

At St Thomas a Becket Catholic Primary School in Eastbourne, the start of 2026 has been a vibrant testament to Catholic Social Teaching in action. Our pupils are truly living out the Gospel, showing that even the smallest hands can make a significant impact on our "Common Home."

Spirituality remains at our heart. Year 5 led a moving Epiphany and Patronal Mass for St Thomas a Becket early in the year, while more recently Fr Barry guided KS2 through Reconciliation and Lent Masses, fostering a culture of reflection. Our Liturgy Leaders deepened their faith at a Spiritual Council Formation Day at St Richard's recently.

In service to others, we held our third Foodbank collection — a key part of our Jubilee Year pledge to support those in need. To promote dignity and inclusion, our World Friendship Ambassador assembly launched a mentor programme in Years 5 and 6, ensuring every child feels valued. We also celebrated the "Dignity of the Person" by welcoming our community for the KS1 Grandparents Tea and Read.

Looking ahead, Year 5 is preparing a powerful Passion Play for Easter and our Eco-Warriors are launching a grounds makeover to protect our environment, as stewards of God's beautiful world. With an upcoming KS2 Grandparents Mass and our ongoing Buddy Masses, we also continue to strengthen the bonds of our parish family.

## Pupils launch Youth Faith Fund

Pupils at St Richard's Catholic College in Bexhill are excited to be spearheading an ongoing Youth Faith Fund fundraising campaign in collaboration with deanery parishes. The fund hopes to help ensure that money is not a barrier for young people seeking to deepen their faith through pilgrimages and retreats.

This year six pupils from St Richard's will join the diocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes in July — five serving as Year 10 and 11 Redshirts and one as a Year 7 family group participant. Thanks to a generous school benefactor, five of the six have received £200 towards their pilgrimage, while one has been awarded a full bursary from the Bosco Trust.

Grateful and eager to do more — not just for themselves but for future young people — the students, together with Lay-Chaplain Jo Doyle, Governor Samantha Vickers and parish youth leaders are working on launching a Youth Faith Fund. The ring-fenced fund will support current and future young people seeking faith experiences.

Fundraising will begin soon in school with a raffle and fun school event (details to follow), and parish fundraising is due to take place at St Mary Magdalene Parish, St Wilfrid Parish and Our Lady of Ransom Parish where the pupils are parishioners.

"We're really excited to get everyone involved — we're thinking of hosting a parish family quiz night soon so everyone can have fun while helping young people in church" said Oskar and Raizel from St Wilfrid Church.

This project shows the power of community, faith, and collaboration, as parish spaces are revitalised while young people gain skills, confidence, and employability.

## 40 Hours' Adoration at St Thomas'

Everyone is warmly invited and encouraged to join the Parish of the Good Shepherd at St Thomas' Church in St Leonards for 40 Hours' Adoration, beginning with the Mass of Exposition at 7pm on Tuesday 12 May.

This is a special opportunity to spend quiet time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, offering your prayers for your family, our parish, and the needs of the wider world. Come for as long as you can — even a short time in His presence is a powerful gift.

The Forty Hours' Devotion holds profound significance in Catholic tradition as a powerful expression of reverence for Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. This practice, dating back to the 16th century, involves continuous prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, solemnly exposed on the altar for forty hours, symbolising the time Jesus spent in the tomb between His crucifixion and resurrection. It serves as a communal and personal opportunity to deepen faith, seek spiritual renewal, and offer reparation for sins, uniting the faithful in a shared act of love and devotion.

## Pilgrimage to Poland 2026

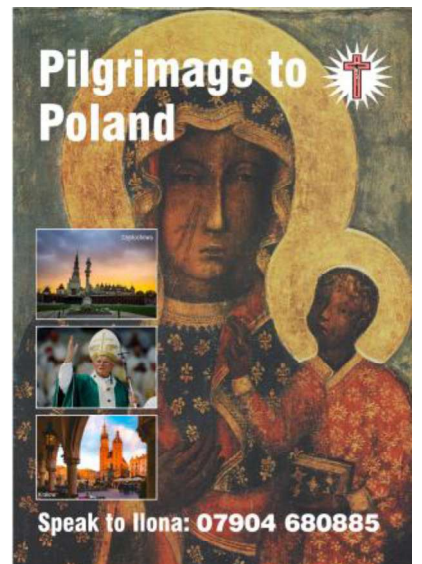

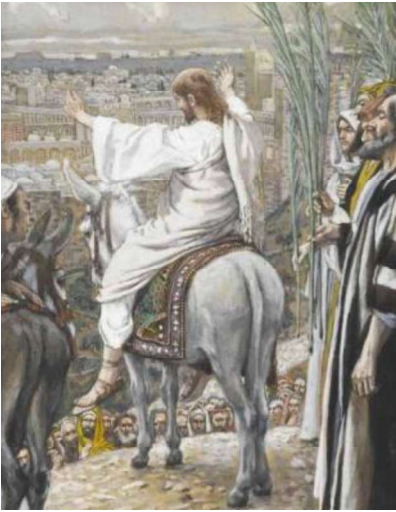

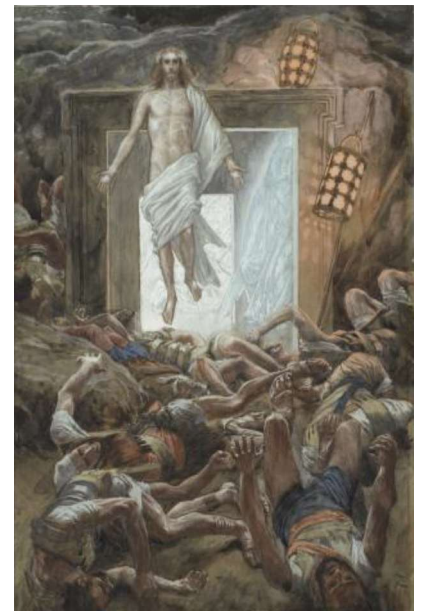

His birthday falls during Lent (5 March), and this year parishioners marked the occasion with two celebrations. A small gathering followed Mass at Our Lady of Ransom on the day itself, while a larger celebration took place after the Sunday 11:30am Mass at St Agnes, where more than fifty parishioners enjoyed a generous buffet and a delicious cake prepared by Annette.
